The Science and Evidence Base for Skin-to-Skin Contact

Identify key elements of developmental neuroscience. Explain the reproductive behavior common to mammals and humans. Recognize separation behaviors in premature infants, newborns and adults. Contrast the physiology of normal versus separated newborn infants.

Kangaroo Mother Care: Restoring the Original Paradigm for Infant Care
Review the "evolution" of Western neonatal care. Describe the clinical significance of 'birth skin-to-skin contact'. Relate the findings and significance of the first study on "birth skin-to-skin contact". Interpret research results on the basis of recent neuroscience. Describe the relevance of neuroscience to the early neonatal period.

Understand developmental continuity and adapt practice to developmental needs. Relate additional neuroscience processes that impact breastfeeding. Describe the sensory capabilities of the fetus and newborn. Start implementation of better perinatal practices.
