Divya Sinha Parikh is a board certified pediatrician practicing in Columbus, OH. She received her medical training at The University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine and completed her residency in general pediatrics at Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital at Case Western Reserve University. Dr. Parikh has taken an active interest in breastfeeding education and outreach by teaching on various platforms - pediatric residency curriculum, Academy of Breastfeeding Medicine annual conference, local breastfeeding coalitions, GOLD Lactation and IABLE (Institute for the Advancement of Breastfeeding and Lactation Education). She also serves on the Ohio Lactation Consultant Association to promote statewide breastfeeding outreach and initiatives.

# Dr. Jenny Thomas, MD, MPH, IBCLC, FAAP, FABM

Dr. Jenny Thomas is a pediatrician and breastfeeding medicine specialist in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Community and Family Medicine and Pediatrics at the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW). She is a graduate of Marquette University and the Medical College of Wisconsin. She did her residency at the Medical College of Wisconsin Affiliated Hospitals, served as Chief Resident in Pediatrics, and did a fellowship in Neonatal/Perinatal Medicine. She has been an International Board Certified Lactation Consultant (IBCLC) since 2003. She is now serving her 11th year on the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Section on Breastfeeding Leadership Team. She is a founder and an Immediate-past Chairperson of the Wisconsin Breastfeeding Coalition and continues to serve as the Chapter Breastfeeding Coordinator for the Wisconsin Chapter of the AAP. She has received national advocacy awards, multiple teaching awards, and has been recognized for innovation within her practice and community. She has been published in Clinical Pediatrics, the Journal of Human Lactation, and Breastfeeding Medicine. She is one of physicians recognized as a Fellow of the Academy of Breastfeeding Medicine (FABM) for her expertise on breastfeeding.
